

What do I need to bring to Froglets?

We would like parents to bring in a bag containing some spare clothing and underwear. Nappies, pull ups and wipes if necessary. A suitable coat, gloves and hats in Winter and in Summer a sun hat and sun cream. All items brought into nursery should be clearly named (including shoes).

How does my child self register?

With a little help from you, your child should find their name on the pond outside the room and then knock on the door to be greeted by our staff. Your child will then post his/her name into the class box for use later in the day.

Can I purchase a uniform?

We have a t shirt and sweatshirt with our nursery logo on it for sale in reception. These items are optional but they do prevent your child's clothes from spoiling so they are quite a good idea! If your child wears their own clothing please do not send them in their best clothes as our philosophy at Leaping Frogs is more mess more fun, sensory play is so important to their development and learning!



How do I pay my fees?

You will be invoiced termly, the fees are due at the beginning of each term and should be paid immediately.

On your invoice you will find our bank details so that you can pay directly into our account. You can also pay by cheque (please make cheques payable to Leaping Frogs Day Nursery CIC) or cash, we cannot accept card payments. We accept all child care vouchers.

If your child receives government funding you will only be invoiced for the hours that your child attends over the government funding allocation. All meals will be invoiced for, snacks are included in the fees.



Our daily routine...

When your child arrives in the morning they will free play inside and outside until 10am. The children will then tidy away the toys in preparation for circle time. During circle time staff will discuss the current topic (topic is always displayed on the door, you will also find a slip explaining the current topic in you child's drawer).

Staff will also show items from the show and tell box, these are items the children have brought in from home and should be related to the current topic. (please ensure that your child only brings in one item as the box can get very full!)

After circle time the children split into 3 groups and rotate around 3 activities, one of which is morning snack time.

When all children have finished all the activities the children free play again until story and song time at the end of the morning session. There is a water machine in the room and children can help themselves to a drink at any time.

Lunch is served at 12.30pm and after this the children free play again inside and outside.

The afternoon activities are then set up for the children to participate in. The afternoon session ends with another story time circle. Afternoon snack is at 3pm and those children staying in the nursery beyond 4pm will join the children in Froggie's room. Dinner is served a 4.30pm. Children free play inside and out until their collection time. When collecting, parents should knock on the Froggie's room door and our staff will open it and help you collect all your child's belongings.
